Subject: Re : How to execute a store procedure

Generally you need another pl/sql procedure to call and handle the out variable or an SQLPlus variable to hold the result. Here is an example that uses a SQLPlus variable.

```
UT1 > create or replace procedure testproc(
2 p_var1 out integer
3 ,p_var2 out integer
4 ) is
5 begin
6 p_var1 := 1;
7 p_var2 := 2;
8 end testproc;
9 /
```

Procedure created.

```
UT1 >
UT1 > variable var1 number
UT1 > variable var2 number
UT1 > execute testproc(:var1, :var2);
```

PL/SQL procedure successfully completed.

```
UT1 > print var1
```

```
VAR1
-----
1
```

```
UT1 > print var2
```

```
VAR2
-----
2
```
